86th INTERNATIONAL F.I.C.C. RALLY from 30 September to 9 October 2017 in Jhinshan (New Taipei City)/Taiwan





The rally registration fee (excluding excursions) is € 130 per adult (with their own camping equipment), € 100 for young people between 15 and 30 years of age (with their own camping equipment) and € 50 for children between 5 and 15 years of age. Children under 5 years of age = no charge.

These prices are valid for bookings received before 1 June 2017. There will be a 20% surcharge after this date.

Two excursions will be arranged during the rally at a cost of between € 30 and € 40 per person.

Transport possibilities from the airport to the campsite:

- taxi € 65
- bus € 9 per person
- car rental € 150 per day (it is advisable to book in advance)
- chartering a bus for a maximum of 30 people €450 (to be arranged via the organisers)

A 7-day post-rally through Taiwan will be arranged at the end of the rally. It will start in Jhinshan immediately after the rally and end in Taipei and cost € 700 per person.

The itinerary that goes from the north and west to the south and east of Taiwan will include Sun Moon Lake, Alishan National Park, Kenting National Park and Taroko National Park and any other sights worth visiting en route.

F.I.C.C. Patronage for the GOLDEN RING RALLY in Russia

The Russian State Tourism Agency, CARAVANERS LEAGUE and the Suzdal campsite invite you to take part in the “International Festival of Automobile Travelers and Caravaners“ GOLDEN RING RALLY 2017 in Suzdal.

The Festival takes place from 24 to 30 July 2017 and will give you the opportunity to find out about the history, architecture and culture of Russia.

A special programme of excursions is being laid on.

Every day at the rally site for the duration of the Festival, there will be:

- Tourism exhibitions of the towns and regions in Russia’s Golden Ring
- Displays of souvenirs and national food products
- Russian handicrafts (you can make your own souvenirs)
- Restaurants serving Russian food and drink

A lot of volunteers will be helping out at the Festival offering assistance to participants both at the rally site and during excursions.

There will be opportunities to visit famous cities like Moscow, St. Petersburg, Novgorod, Pskov, Kostroma, Yaroslavl, Rostov Velikiy, Sergiyev Posad, Nizhny Novgorod, Kazan.

The organisers will do their very best to ensure that your journey to the Festival and your excursions and travels around Russia are pleasant, comfortable and safe.

All participants will be given comprehensive information and explanations about service stations, campsites and overnight stopovers (overnight parking areas) in Russia.

Tip from the F.I.C.C. Secretariat:

Köpenick

Köpenick in south-east Berlin (also known as Berlin's "laundry" in the old days), is situated on an island at the confluence of the Dahme and Spree rivers.

It was the centre of Germany's film industry for a long time and it was here that the Eastman Kodak, Agfa and Defa Productions had their studios and factories. The halls and tower blocks are now listed buildings and some have been transformed into luxury apartments.

Treptow-Köpenick is the biggest of Berlin's districts in terms of area. It is renowned for its lush greenery and abundance of water which includes the Müggelsee through which the R. Spree flows. The old town of Köpenick has many beautiful restored houses dating back to the 18th century alongside the town hall and the St. Laurence church and the town's famous baroque castle.

"Der Hauptmann von Köpenick" (The Captain of Köpenick) is a very well-known film by Heinz Rühmann relating the mischievous exploits of one of the town's citizens.

In October 1906, Köpenick hit the headlines at home and abroad thanks to the daring exploit of one Wilhelm Voigt, an out-of-work 57 year old shoemaker. Wearing a captain's uniform that he had acquired, he masqueraded as a Prussian military officer and rounded up ten guards in Köpenick's



brand new town hall. He took the mayor and counter clerks into custody and seized 4000 marks 37 pfennigs from the almost empty municipal treasury.

The public at home and abroad were very amused by this daring feat which exposed the subservient spirit and slavish obedience of the Prussians. Voigt was found and captured ten

days after carrying out this prank. A former fellow prisoner (the shoemaker had already spent 27 years and 6 months behind bars on numerous counts of theft and forgery) had given the police a tip-off. Voigt was jailed for four years but, pardoned by the Kaiser, was released in August 1908.

Köpenick Museum

It is housed in "Schötzes Hof", an old half-timbered house dating back to 1665, with exhibits illustrating the town's history.

Müggelsee

An excursion to this, the largest of Berlin's lakes, is worth doing at any time of the year. Formed during the Pleistocene era along with the Müggelberg hills on its southern shores, the lake is 4.3 kms long, 2.6 kms wide and up to 8 m deep in places. The R. Spree flows through the lake at which point it is known as the Müggelspree. If you are on the lake and the wind gets up, sudden choppy waves should not be taken lightly. Many a helmsman in a small boat has been taken unawares and got into difficulties as the waves got higher. On a really cloudy day, the shores of the lake disappear from view and the lake resembles the open sea.

There are a number of places where one can stay around the lake and, for the most part, towns and small settlements such as Friedrichshagen, Rahnsdorf and Müggelheim have retained their village character. The Friedrichshagen waterworks on the northern shore still take much of their water from the lake. There are numerous deep wells located near the banks that are mainly fed by the bank filtrate and only a small amount comes from groundwater. Siphon pipes conveyed ground water to the waterworks. Clean water is obtained through slow sand filters. It is also a museum.

POST-RALLY 2018

Tips for campers

Old newspaper makes a cloudy vase clear again

Do you have a glass vase that looks unattractively cloudy? You can clean it by filling it up with torn up strips of newspaper and cold water. Leave to stand for two days, then empty out the contents - and your vase will be as new!

Be careful when buying fruit

Look at the labels

- 1) If the label has four digits, any that begin with 3 or 4 means that the fruit was intensively grown i.e. chemical fertiliser was used.
- 2) If the product has five digits and the first is a 9, this indicates that the product was grown in the traditional way i.e. no pesticides or fertilisers were used.
- 3) If the product has five digits and the first is an 8, the product has been genetically modified and you should put it back.

Iceland: Iceland is home to the creepiest museum ever

The small Icelandic coastal town of Holmavik has the world's creepiest museum: the Museum of Magic and Witchcraft. Skeletons in strange attire, books of spells and tricks and relics that can make you disappear are just some of the magic artefacts that one comes across within its walls. The Netherlands

Keukenhof with its huge variety of gaily coloured tulips and other spring flowers will open its doors this year between 23 March and 21 May, from 8 am to 7.30 pm.

Entrance for adults is €16, and €8 for children between 4 and 11 years of age. There is no charge for small children under 3.

Italy

Italy has drastically increased fines for traffic offences since 1 January 2017. In addition, using a mobile phone unless it is a hands-free device will in future result in you losing your driver's licence for up to two months. For holders of a foreign driver's licence, this would amount to a ban on driving in Italy.

France

Clean air stickers in France – order yours in good time.

Anyone wanting to drive their car in a city centre in France will need a clean air sticker from now on, just like Germany. After Paris and Grenoble, Lyon has now been declared an environmental zone. France is expected to add another 20 towns this year. Anyone wanting to visit one of these cities by



car from 1 April will need to display a Crit'Air sticker on their windscreen. You can order one on line from www.crit-air.fr

You need to fill in your family name, first name, street name and number, post code, town, country and your vehicle registration number.

To complete the process, apart from your e-mail address, you need to give details of your ID, and the date of registration and make of your vehicle. All of the data given must correspond to the information on the vehicle registration document.

The Crit'Air sticker will only be sent to the address given on the vehicle registration document. Old vehicles registered before 1.1.1997 will not qualify for a sticker at all. Payment is by credit card only or by pre-payment and the sticker will be sent to you by mail.

Germany

Don't forget the emergency lane

For decades now, it has been compulsory in Germany to make way for the emergency services on a multi-laned highway when traffic is at a standstill. This invariably proved to be problematic in practice, so the regulation in § 11, paragraph 2 of the Highway Code has been simplified. As the holiday season is about to start, we would ask all campers to heed this regulation which states:

“As soon as traffic on a motorway or a road outside an urban area with at least two lanes in each direction slows down to walking pace or comes to a complete standstill, vehicles must move over to the extreme left and the immediate right lanes in order to form an emergency lane to allow police cars and other emergency service vehicles to pass.”

This regulation should ensure that the police and emergency services can drive freely through the traffic.

Vignette Austria/Switzerland

Austria has put up the cost of its motorway vignette slightly for 2017. An annual vignette for a passenger car now costs € 86.40, a two-month vignette € 25.90 and a ten-day vignette € 8.90.

In Switzerland the annual vignette for private cars and motorcycles is CHF 40 i.e. €38.50. Unlike Switzerland, Austria does not require an extra vignette for trailers or caravans towed by a passenger car.

Car drivers caught without a valid vignette in Austria are fined €120 on the spot. In Switzerland the fine can be as much as CHF 200. Even displaying a vignette in the wrong place can result in a fine.

The correct place for sticking a vignette is on the inside of the windscreen, either at the top left hand side or in the rear mirror area. The windscreen should be clean and dry and not colder than 5°C. It should not however be stuck on the tinted band.
